## **Greetings From The East**

Esteemed brethren, The month of May is reminiscent of the beauty and majesty of the world around us. Just as nature awakens from its slumber and blooms with new life, so too do we as Masons continue to seek the light and knowledge that is the cornerstone of our craft.

May has historically been a month of great significance to the Masonic Order. May 1, 1793 was the date that President



George Washington laid the cornerstone for the Executive Mansion, which is now known as the White House. The ceremony was also marked by a Masonic ritual, with Washington using a silver trowel to spread mortar on the cornerstone. Like the Capitol cornerstone ceremony, several other key figures involved in the construction of the White House were also Freemasons.

On May 24, 1736, the first recorded meeting of what would later become the Grand Lodge of Scotland took place. On this date, representatives from several Scottish lodges met at the "Lodge in Edinburgh," which is now known as Mary's Chapel, and agreed to form a new Grand Lodge which was then formed later that year in December.

On May 31, 1801, the Supreme Council of the Scottish Rite was officially established in Charleston, South Carolina, and the meeting was presided over by Illustrious Brother John Mitchell, who served as the first Sovereign Grand Commander. The establishment of the Supreme Council helped to solidify the role and structure of the Scottish Rite in the United States Masonic hierarchy.

During our Stated Meeting May 4th, I hope we can put in motion the principles of brotherly love, relief, and truth that guide us in our daily lives and help us objectively and clearly attend to the business of our Lodge. Hopefully we continue to support and uplift each other in our journey towards self-improvement and enlightenment.

To honor the life and legacy of Benjamin Franklin, I am delighted to announce that on May 11, 2023, Illustrious Jim Hoerricks, Phd and 33°, will orate a detailed accounting of Franklin's life and how Freemasonry shaped his life. This event will serve as a testament to the enduring influence of one of the fraternity's most esteemed members.

We plan to initiate 6 new members in our Lodge this month. Three on May 18th and three more on May 25th. # ELYSIAN LODGE, OUR HISTORY Part 4, A New Home in Los Feliz

The new Elysian Masonic Temple in Los Feliz had become a reality and provided the spacious and modern accommodations desired by the membership. It's design and construction was successfully accomplished and the Grand Lodge of California had performed the official Dedication ceremony. The next step was the physical relocation of Elysian Lodge No. 418 from its Echo Park location of the previous 46 years to it's new building which was to become our Lodges home for many generations into the future.

The pride and enthusiasm enjoyed by the members resulting from this accomplishment was made possible by the personal responsibility and dedication by so many Elysian members. They all worked together to make it happen. From obtaining the land, developing the design and managing the construction through completion.......They all delivered the project.

It is appropriate to refer back to an item of history displayed in our Echo Park Lodge room. Permanently painted on the wall above the Senior Warden's station was a representation of a banner displaying the words "Many Hands Make Heavy Burdens Light". This had been an ongoing theme for Elysian Lodge especially during its formative years. The theme was still alive and well!

An overview of the new building at the time of it's completion in 1959 reveal some of the changes made over the years to both layout and furnishings to accommodate its current use.

The exterior of the building consisted of relatively simple Architectural features but provid-

ed a Stately appearance at the Northeast corner of North Vermont and Franklin. It was considered unique at the time to be designed with windowless Exterior walls, 100% mechanically ventilated, heated and cooled and it is believed to be one of the first buildings permitted as such in Los Angeles.





Elysian's Lodge Room

The original Classic design of our Lodge Room although modified over the years still contains furniture relocated from the Echo Park Lodgeroom consisting of all of the Officers chairs and the Secretaries desk. The Masters, Senior and Junior Wardens pedestals plus the Altar were constructed specifically for the new Lodge room. The original Hammond organ was presented to Elysian by 1935 Past Master Henry Coley and his wife and the



two Ashlers were presented to Elysian by 1958 Past Master Kenneth E. Hill. Theater style seating was installed on both Lodge room sidelines.

Major alterations occurred in the early 2000's when changes were made to provide the ability to change the Lodge room into a "Courtroom set" for use as a Filming location by the Motion Picture and Television industries. The original Masters pedestal was replaced with a custom built "Judges Bench" and the Sideliners Theater seats were removed to provide "Jury and witness Boxes" and replaced with Courtroom style benches constructed for the purpose. Currently, the original seats are in storage onsite and the original Masters Pedestal is being utilized in our Historical/Conference room.

These changes provided the Lodge the opportunity to obtain Rental income greatly enhancing our ability to maintain and support our buildings operation.

### The Rotunda

The building's Rotunda provides access to all areas of Elysian Temple and is a main entry and exit to Vermont Avenue. It was designed with a high, domed ceiling illuminated indirectly be a custom Chandelier designed and manufactured specifically for Elysian.

Located on the south wall is a Display case presented to Elysian by Doyle and Lena Haltom to contain the 25year Anniversary plaques honoring Elysian Past Masters from the 25th, 50th, 75th, and 100th year celebrations.



## The Banquet and Dining Room

One of Elysians' most valuable features is the Mural which was painted on the entire north wall. It was painted by Millard Sheets, renown Artist, Muralist and designer also recognized for his designs in the Scottish Rite buildings in Los Angeles and San Francisco and the old Home Savings building murals throughout Southern California



Displayed on the south wall is Elysian's Past Masters "Photo Gallery" which was originally begun in the Dining Room of our original Lodge building in 1916 and is still continued today. The bottom row are Masters of the old building. The top row are of Masters in our current building.

The west end of the room contains a stage which has been utilized over the years by Elysian and many other organizations for a variety of activities, events and presentations. The stage piano was presented to Elysian by 1959 Past Master Arthur L. Holt.

### Historical/Conference Room

The meeting location for Elysian Masonic Temple Association and various committees, etc. The rooms use has been expanded in recent years to provide a visual history of Elysian Lodge consisting of Photos and memorabilia dating back to its inception.

**Cloak Room -** Originally purposed to accommodate the storage of coats, etc. while attending activities at our building. It has since been converted to the Office of Elysian Lodge.

**The Phone Booth** (A vestige of the past) Located in the hallway where Elysian's Pay Phone (and phone directories) were once located. It exists currently as a "tiny" closet.

**The Lounge -** Located off the Rotunda it contains Elysian's library which has been recently expanded, The original DeMolay trophy case installed in 1959 which also includes Elysian Lodge and Jobs Daughters items. Tables and seating exists for socializing and gatherings.

Over the years the Lounge has been expanded to include a Pool table and Flat screen T.V. and is designed to provide a welcoming area for all.


# A Quick Primer On Ben Franklin
