ELYSIAN LODGE, OUR HISTORY

Part 1, A New Lodge is born

One hundred thirteen years ago, on May 20th, 1910, thirteen Master Masons met at the home of Brother J. Ira Moyse at



1219 North Alvarado Street in Los Angeles for the purpose of taking necessary measures for the establishment of a lodge of Free and Accepted Masons. They had been called together by Brother Moyse, whose interest in Masonry and the northwest section of the city had given him a conception that became a vision, then a reality. These thirteen Masons became the Charter Members of Elysian Lodge No. 418 in the City of Los Angeles, State of California.

The first action taken at this preliminary meeting was the passing of a resolution. "That the Lodge now sought to be established shall be called Elysian Lodge, the name being selected for two reasons: Firstly, the proposed location being near Elysian Park, it in a measure identifies its location; and secondly that the mythological meaning would be peculiarly expressive of the harmony existing in a well-regulated lodge"

The next item of business was the selection by ballot of Brother J. Ira Moyse as Master, Brother Frank Finlayson as Senior Warden, and Brother Enoch Troxel as Junior Warden. A committee was appointed to prepare a Petition for Dispensation dated May 20, 1910 to be presented to the Grand Master to "Form and open a lodge of Free and Accepted Masons at this place, to be called Elysian Lodge."

A Dispensation was granted by Grand Master W. Frank Pierce on July 23, 1910.

The first Stated Meeting of Elysian Lodge was held on July 25, 1910 and the first Petitions for Membership were received, a total of five which included one from Reginald Clapp who became Master of our Lodge in 1916 and later became our Inspector.

During the second Stated Meeting held on August 25, 1910 Brother Clapp became the first candidate to receive a Degree in Elysian Lodge and Brother Rae Van Cleve became the first Affiliate to join Elysian and was elected Master in 1917.

At the third Stated Meeting held September 22,1910 a petition to the Grand Lodge was drafted requesting that a Charter be granted to Elysian Lodge. Brothers John

Ira Moyse and Frank Finlayson were elected as delegates to Grand Lodge and the petition was presented at the annual convocation in October 1910. A Charter was granted to Elysian Lodge on October 13, 1910 and he number 418

was assigned. Dana Reid Weller became Grand Master at that session of the Grand Lodge and was our first Grand Master under charter.

Our first Inspector was Dr. Samuel E. Burke who became Grand Master in 1922 and installed twenty of Elysian's Masters.


The design used on Elysian's Letterhead was made by a young artist who knew nothing of Masonry, but followed Brother Moyse's request that...

"It consist of a dove, two pillars, and a representation of the Elysian Fields between them, over the Square and Compass."

Elysian Lodge's first meeting place was at the Masonic Temple at Pico and Figueroa Streets in Los Angeles. On September 26, 1912 Brother Findlayson introduced a resolution in Lodge which was unanimously carried authorizing our relocation to a new

building at the Northeast corner of Sunset Boulevard and Echo Park Avenue. The move was completed in early December 1912 and became Elysian Lodge's home for forty six years. To be continued...

to the worthy man in misfortune, to whom it gives assistance;


to the afflicted, on whom it lavishes consolation;
