This warrant was issued by the Grand Master at the time, the Duke of Beaufort. The Antiquity Lodge No. 2 was one of the four founding lodges of the Premier Grand Lodge of England.

The Lodge of Antiquity No. 274 in Madras, India, was granted a charter by the Grand Lodge of Scotland on August 24, 1752. This charter allowed the Lodge to operate under the authority of the Grand Lodge of Scotland and played a significant role in the history of Freemasonry in India.

Of course, our trestleboard wouldn't be complete without a mention of our upcoming Masonic Education with Dr. Hoerricks on August 24th and degree conferrals on August 10th and 31st. Come together and support our brothers as they take their important step in their

masonic journey and let us all improve ourselves through learning with Illustrious Jim.

As summer winds down, let's carry with us the lessons we have learned and the bonds we have forged this past season. May we continue to support and uplift one another, as we strive to embody the principles of Masonry.

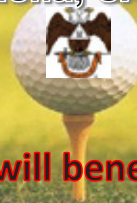

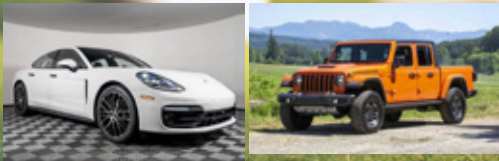

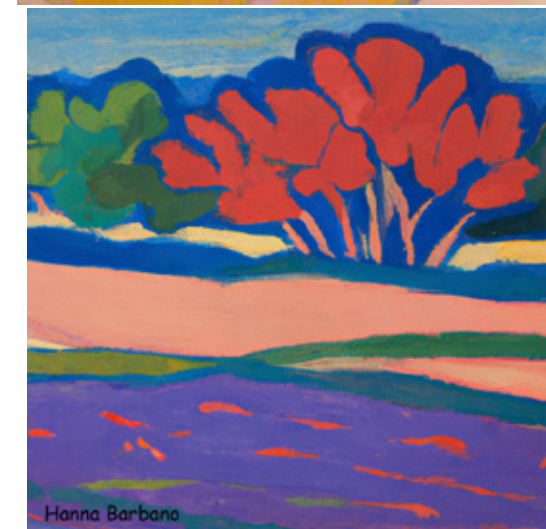

Book Review - The Civility Mosaic

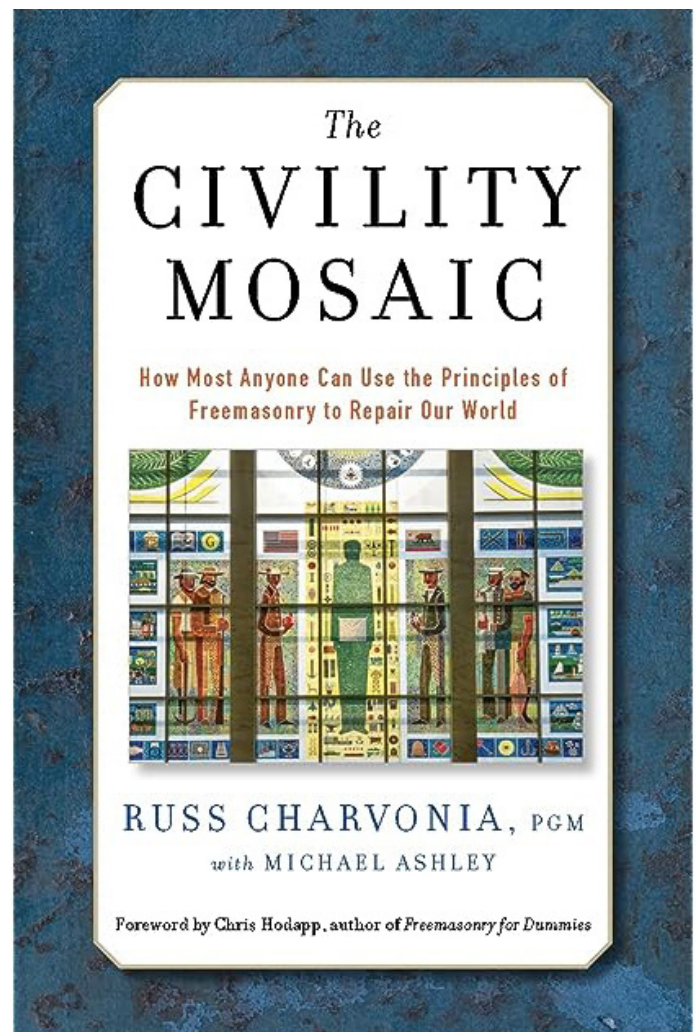
The spirit of America has often produced a book, a speech or a leader needed specifically for a challenging period of our history. In many of these instances, it has been a Mason who provided that leadership. Going from Paine's "Common Sense," which Worshipful George Washington read to his troops, to Brothers Will Rogers' humor and FDR's reassuring Fireside Chats during the Great Depression, we have, as a people, risen to address the problem of the times.

The book that Most Worshipful Charvonia and Brother Ashley have co-written fit into the category described above. Restoring civility is no longer an option. It is a matter of survival. Many have lamented the decline of civility and ethics in our society. This book provides a path to restore civility in our society. My initial thought about this book was that it would address the usual topics of incivility - cyberbullying and the current state of politics. But the book doesn't limit itself to these two topics. It boldly goes into every sphere of life - the workplace, houses of worship, family relations - parents, in-laws, and any area where incivility can erupt - and be extinguished.

Using Masonic history and teachings, academic research, the book discusses how society went wrong, and how we apply Masonic lessons and take the civility of the lodge into the world. This is a great book - based in Masonic principles, but not for Masons only. Any person can read this book and apply the teachings it espouses. Masonic Light can drive out the darkness that has engulfed our modern society and Masonic principles applied in all of the orbits of our lives can bring about a more civil society. While we might not be called upon in the way that Washington and FDR were, we can still make a big difference in restoring civility in our own communities.

MW Charvonia has led the crusade for civility since 2013, conceiving of the idea of using Masonic teachings to restore civility, beginning with a discussion with fellow Grand Master John Cooper. Together, they launched the Masonic Family Civility Project in 2014.

ELYSIAN LODGE - OUR HISTORY

Part 6 by Bob Petersen, PM

Elysian Masonic Temple and the Temple Association

This chapter of Elysian Lodge's History takes a look at the Elysian Masonic Temple Association. Founded in 1912, Incorporated in 1914, it has operated continuously through the present day as an integral part of Elysian Lodge No. 418 F&AM.

Consisting of a Board of Directors comprised exclusively of members of Elysian Lodge it was organized for the sole purpose of administering and managing all Business affairs of Elysian Masonic Temple. First at our Lodge's original building at Sunset Blvd. and Echo Park Ave. until 1960 and now continuing at our current Los Feliz location 111 years later.

The concept of owning and operating our own "Home" for Elysian Lodge was an original goal of the Lodge Founders and has been successfully continued by each successive generation of Elysian's membership.

Beside conducting the daily business of Elysian Temple, managing the Financial aspect of the Board's responsibilities is of Prime importance especially when considering the costs involved in the operation of our Building and Facilities. Expenses such as Taxes, Insurances, Utilities, Maintenance and Repairs, etc. are substantial and require continuous effort to generate and maintain an adequate Cash Flow from the operation of our building operations. This must cover not only current overhead and operating expenses but also provide the resources necessary to provide resources for a secure and successful future.

At our original Echo Park Building the process of generating revenue from it's operations was rather straight forward as the original design of the two story building dedicated the entire first floor to Commercial store rentals. Elysian Lodge was the only organization occupying the building with all Lodge facilities located on the second floor.

A different concept for generating revenue at our new Los Feliz building was envisioned at the time the building was designed and the property developed. Revenue was to be derived from rental of our building and facilities to a variety of Masonic Organizations. Also, to non-Masonic groups as well to conduct their meetings and events.

The following list of tenants who occupied the new Elysian Temple provides an interesting perspective of the organizations who conducted their operations at Elysian for various periods of time from our building's opening in 1960 to the early 2000's.

Elysian's facilities became a popular meeting venue and were occupied practically every day of the week with several groups conducting daytime meetings and events. An interesting note.... The facility was very seldom utilized for one-time rentals, only full time tenants on a continuing basis.

After a period of many years of successfully renting to these Organizations it was becoming apparent that some were experiencing declines in their membership. This was resulting in their either downsizing, relocating to smaller and less expensive accommodations or in certain cases merging with other, like, organizations.

It seemed as if we were entering a period of time when the popularity of many Social and Fraternal organizations was on the wane. Obviously this negatively impacted the revenue we received from rentals. Changing from our long established Business model would require a totally different approach by Elysian Temple Association relative to finances and an entirely different way of Marketing our Building.

A New Direction....

Elysian had previously rented our Parking Lot numerous times to the Film Industry for use as a Base Camp or Truck, Trailer and Auto parking and several contacts with Site Rep's had been made. Through one of these contacts Elysian was approached by a Major Studio with a request to rent the interior of Elysian Temple and allow their temporary conversion of our Lodge room into a "Court Room " set for filming. An agreement was reached, the filming was performed and the overall results were successful.

A new era for Elysian Masonic Temple Association had begun.

The ability to easily convert our Lodge Room into a Court Room for filming and back again for Elysian's use as a Masonic Lodge Room has greatly enhanced the Revenue producing ability of Elysian Temple. Over the last few years a majority of the interior of Elysian Masonic Temple has been utilized for filming purposes.

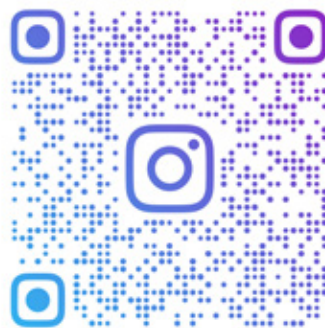
