


Greetings From The East

Meet The Prospects Nemo Gray

Meet Nemo Gray, one of Elysian's prospects I had the chance to interview. Nemo has had a unique journey. He's a U.S. Air Force veteran who worked in cybersecurity for ten years before being medically retired. After that, instead of settling down right away, he spent seven years traveling the world on a motorcycle, where he explored art, theater, culture, and history. Now, he lives in Los Angeles with his wife, Anahit, who is an actress. Together, they're focused on building a life in LA, balancing family goals with creative projects and even a new business idea involving AI and Web3 technology.

Nemo's childhood was unique because he grew up between two very different households, one in Hawaii and the other in Alaska. Each side had its own values about money, spirituality, and community, which gave him a wide perspective on life. On top of that, his time in the military and the challenges he faced afterward taught him resilience, discipline, and empathy. Today, he says his main values are creativity, integrity, and service.





When I asked him what got him interested in Freemasonry, he said it started with curiosity.

While traveling, he noticed signs of Masonry in architecture and traditions around the world.

What stuck with him most was the idea of a brotherhood that's been focused on moral growth and service for centuries. After moving to Los Angeles, he kept passing by Elysian Lodge and eventually felt like it was a sign to reach out.

Nemo hopes Masonry will give him mentorship, friendship, and a space where he can combine discipline, learning, and creativity. To him, brotherhood means being there for each other, not just socially, but in hard times too. He's excited to contribute in any way he can, whether that's simply helping out or sharing bigger ideas for how the Lodge can grow in the

future. Looking ahead, Nemo hopes to build a live/work production studio in Los Angeles, raise a family, and continue making a positive impact in his community. In Masonry, he wants to grow as a brother, mentor others, and keep learning more about ritual and symbolism. Overall, Nemo's story shows how much he values growth, service, and lifting others, qualities that make him a strong fit for Freemasonry.




